Christopher Gaze

Bard on the Beach Festival founder, artistic director and, at times, performer

*“20th Anniversary of the Festival
and insights on Shakespeare and theatre”*

Christopher Gaze is best known as Artistic Director and founder of Vancouver’s *Bard on the Beach* Shakespeare Festival. The Festival has seen its annual attendance grow from 6,000 in its first season in 1990 to more than 80,000 in recent years.

During his professional acting career spanning more than three decades Christopher has performed in virtually every major centre across Canada, as well as in England and the USA. He was born and educated in England and trained as an actor at the Bristol Old Vic Theatre School. His voice is heard regularly in cartoon series, commercials and on the radio and he was inducted into the BC Entertainment Hall of Fame in 2002.

In addition to his role as Artistic Director, Christopher frequently performs and directs at the *Bard*. He hosts two unique concert series for the VSO, Tea & Trumpets and the traditional Christmas Concert. He is a guest host on the Knowledge Network and a is gifted public speaker.

He often shares his insights on the theatre and Shakespeare with school groups, service organizations and local businesses. In May 2005 he was honored by the Governor General with Canada’s Meritorious Service Medal.

Red Robinson has been in the entertainment business for more than 56 years and on July 13th at Probus North Shore he demonstrated through his address just why he has enjoyed such enduring popularity.

His upbeat approach to life is inspirational and as he said, and I paraphrase, life is an amazing journey and it's vital that you follow your dreams. He did that from the age of 12 when he first determined what he wanted to pursue as a vocation.

Red is amazing in his recall of dates and events and we enjoyed the nostalgia surrounding his encounters with Bill Haley and the Comets, Elvis, Terry and Susan Jacks, to name but a few. In fact during Expo 86 he arranged the appearance of 41 different acts.

Red shared with us numerous anecdotal stories regarding celebrities. Here are but three:

... during the Beatles Vancouver appearance fans kept crowding closer and closer to the stage so their manager, Brian Epstein, asked Red to go on stage and attempt to calm things down. He no sooner set foot on stage when John Lennon told him "get the #\$%& off our stage". At the mention of Epstein's name Red's presence was immediately accepted.

... When interviewing Buddy Holly in the early days of Rock and Roll, Red asked Buddy how long he thought R&R would last. The answer is classic "Maybe until Christmas!"

... During Red's short sojourn in Portland Oregon he was in the habit of playing all his music at very high in-studio volume until one day when the man in the next studio who was attempting to make a recording

for a charitable cause stuck his head in the door and asked him to tone it down. It was JFK. As Red explained, one meets the famous and not so famous often in strange ways and places.

Red related his times in the advertising agency business where his agency had the original account for MacDonald's account in Canada and his hosting of national television game shows. His involvement as host of the annual Timmy's Christmas Telethon spanned 23 years and he now devotes much energy to support of the Child Foundation which is concerned with finding a cure for Crohn's disease, liver and intestinal disorders.

One last memorable anecdote. In 1958 he was in Los Angeles when he first heard a song being recorded for the local telethon by a then unknown singer. He loved it, got a copy and brought it back to Vancouver where he gave it a lot of air time which led to interest by a music industry promoter. The song was *Fever*, the singer was Peggy Lee, and the rest is history.

For someone who has accomplished so much and still is, it could be said he's still got "*Fever*".

Annual General Meeting

The Club's AGM will precede our guest speaker's presentation at the meeting on Monday September 14. Announcements have been made alerting members to the nomination process for the election of officers, and the Nominations Committee, under Chair Art Eberwein, has prepared a proposed slate of officers.

Our Bylaws require that "any notice of motion shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary and communicated to the membership at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which it is to be considered." The Election will take place during the Annual General Meeting Sept. 14.

Election of Officers

The following officers are to be elected for a one-year term: President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The candidates proposed by the Nominating Committee for those offices are presented on page 3.

Qualification for Nomination

A nominee must be a current member of the Club and must be nominated by a current member of the Club in good standing at least two weeks prior to the AGM in September.

The nominee must accept the nomination either orally at a meeting or in writing at least two weeks prior to the AGM. The deadline for nominations, therefore, will be Friday, August 28.

Nominations/Election Committee

The Nominations/Election Committee will prepare and distribute the final slate of duly qualified candidates for election.

Election

In the event that more than one candidate stands for a particular office, a vote by ballot will decide the winner. The elected officers will assume their positions immediately following their election.
