“Part II - Behind the Berlin Wall: Best Escapes, Resisting the State and Poster Propaganda in Cold War East Germany”



Dennis Molnar returns on January 8th with part 2 of his talk on the historic impact of the Berlin Wall. Comments from members following the first talk in November were very favourable. Don't miss the next instalment!

Life was difficult in this Police State - especially seeing prosperous West Germany next door. Join us to see the most creative and the best Escapes made. We will meet a Lady who escaped and meet a Man whose Resistance risked 1,200 years in jail. The Poster Propaganda you will see seems unbelievable today, but why was it believable then? Common thinking is that the Wall fell because the Soviets said they would not interfere, but we will uncover secrets that prove the Wall fell for a very different reason.

Dennis Molnar was schooled in Britain and Canada and went on to receive University Engineering and Business Degrees. He was the Managing Director of a High Technology company, has served on various Advisory Boards and has been a Director of a Listed Company. He is a past Director of the BC Winston Churchill Society and for over 20 years has presented Cold War and World War II history widely to Businesses, Professional Groups, Museums and Societies. He and his wife have two daughters and live in Vancouver.

A few of his other lectures include: The Two Best Allied Spies of WW II; Mistakes, Luck, and Disobeying Hitler: The Deciding Factors in the Chase and Sinking of the Bismarck in World War II; The Spitfire Fighter of World War II and Puzzles and Enigmas: The Cat and Mouse Codebreaking Game of World War II.

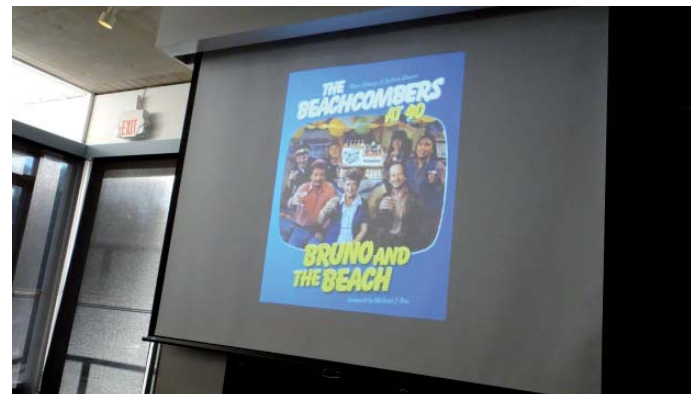
